CARROLLTON,

(FORMERLY PORT WILLIAM,)

A post village and the capital of Carroll county, situated on the Ohio at the mouth of the Kentucky river, 45 miles north-west from Frankfort, 68 miles south-west from Covington, 45 miles north-east from Louisville, and, by river, 80 miles below Covington, and 62 above Louisville.

In addition to the usual county buildings, it contains five churches, (Methodist, Presbyterian, Baptist, Reformed and Catholic,) one Seminary, one Academy, two select schools, one library association, one Masonic lodge, (Carrollton, No. 134, Carroll Chapter, No. 55,) three lodges I. O. O. F., (Brownski, No. 64, Carroll, No. 45, Henry, No. 101,) one bank, (Branch Southern Bank of Kentucky, capital \$200,000, W. B. Winslow, president, John A. Crawford, cashier,) four steam flouring mills, two steam and one water saw mill, three hotels, ten or twelve stores, one druggist, six physicians, six attorneys, two magistrates, three bakers, two packers, two brick yards, one brewer, one carding machine, two coopers and about fifty journeymen, three distillers, two tanners, two jewelers, two marble yards, two milliners, one tobacconist, and about thirty mechanical trades. Population 1,500. Post office established in 1798.
