THE NEW SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

NO. 1. CARROLLTON.

Beginning at the mouth of Kentucky river; thence up the Ohio river to the foot of Fifth street in the town of Carrollton; thence with Fifth street to Seminary street; thence with Seminary street to the alley between Fourth and Fifth streets; thence with said alley to Clay street; thence with Clay street to Fifth street; thence with Fifth street to the town limits; thence same course to the Kentucky river; thence down said river to the beginning.

NO. 2. COX'S.

Beginning at J. J. Hayden's lower line, on Kentucky river; thence up said river to the line between Dr. J. V. Conn and Dr. P. C. Ellis; thence with said line to the muddy fork of Whites Run; thence up muddy fork (including the farm of Wm. H. Wilson and the Sam Ailiff farm) to Thomas Slater's, including his farm; thence to the George Myers place including it, thence to A. E. Searcy, including his farm; thence to F. M. Mitchell including his farm; thence to Daniel Cox including his farm; thence to I. W. Craig including his farm; thence with the Ogburn road to the Ohio river; thence down the Ohio river to the line between Jno. W. Batts and Mrs. Esther Leap; thence with said line to the top of the hill; thence with the back lines of the farms of Mrs. Leap, M. I. Barker, Thomas Graves, A. R. Gaunt, to the corner of Wesley Lostutter and A. R. Gaunt's lands; thence with the back lines of Wesley and Peter Lostutter (his Six farm) and T. C. Hayden, to line between T. C. and J. J. Hayden; thence with said line to the place of beginning.

NO. 3. WHITES RUN CREEK.

Beginning on Kentucky river on the line between George and Clarence Dean; thence with said line to the top of the hill; thence with a straight line to the old Cropper house including it; thence to L. Leachman's residence excluding it but including his farm; thence to James Davis' excluding his land; thence to William McCreery's including his farm; thence down Wolf Run to Whites Run; thence to Geo. W. O'Neal's excluding his land north of Whites Run creek; thence to Jno. C. Duvall excluding his farm; thence with the Boone road to Thomas Slater excluding his farm; thence down Muddy Fork (excluding the farms of Sam'l Ailiff and Wm. H. Wilson) to the line between Dr. P. C. Ellis and Dr. J. V. Conn; thence with said line to the Kentucky river; thence up said river to the beginning.

NO. 4. GHENT.

Beginning on the Ohio river at the lower line of Sol Wright's home farm thence with said line to McCool's creek; thence with the lower line of the H. W. Wise farm to Thos. O'Neal including his farm; thence to Philip Cushman including his farm; thence to Mrs. Lau Chapman including her farm; thence to Simeon Thompson including his farm; thence to the Ghent & Eagle Creek turnpike; thence with the pike to William and John Huston including their land; thence to William Eugelke including his

farm; thence to Mrs. John Montgomery's including her land; thence to William Davis excluding his farm; thence with the Boone road to McCool's creek road; thence with McCool's creek road to C. H. Cox's excluding his farm; thence to the W. H. Tandy farm, excluding it; thence to the J. Q. Tandy farm, including it; thence to Robert S. Tandy's excluding his farm; thence to Taylor Fathergill's excluding his farm; thence to Gal Montgomery's, excluding his farm; thence to the mouth of Wolf Run; thence up Wolf Run to William McCreery's, excluding his farm; thence to the beginning.

NO. 8. WHITES RUN.

Beginning at Robert S. Tandy's upper line on Whites Run; thence to the A. R. Forsee farm, including it; thence to E. A. Bersor's including his farm; thence to John Sherman's, including his farm; thence with the Buck Run road to the farm of W. R. Griffith (formerly owned by J. Warren Allbutt) including it; thence a straight line to Wm. Ohne's residence, excluding the farm of Alex. Thompson (formerly owned by Sim Brooks) and including Wm. Ohne's farm, except that portion purchased by him from McMakin; thence to R. L. Bond's including his farm; thence with his line to four-mile road; thence a straight line to B. F. Bond's including his farm; thence a straight line to Jno. C. Duvall's including his farm; thence to G. W. O'Neal's including his land on the north side of Whites Run; thence to the mouth of Wolf Run; thence to Gal Montgomery's including his farm; thence to Taylor Fathergill's including his farm; thence a straight line to the beginning.

NO. 9. WORTHVILLE.

Beginning at the mouth of Eagle Creek; thence up said creek to the upper line of John May's farm; thence with said line to R. L. Hunt's back line; thence following the top of the hill to Thomas I. Driskell's house, including it, but excluding the rest of the farm; thence a straight line to Mrs. Bullet's house on the pike excluding it; thence south to the Kentucky river; thence up said river to the beginning.

NO. 10. PRESTONVILLE.

Beginning at the mouth of Kentucky river; thence down the Ohio river to the lower line of John Patton's farm, including said farm; thence to James G. King's on Little Kentucky river, including his farm; thence up Little Kentucky river to the upper line of Mrs. A. J. Taylor's farm, including said farm; thence down the Little Kentucky river so as to include the farm of Richard Metcalf, A. H. Myers, S. S. Carlisle; thence to Wm. Wyatt's, including his farm; thence to S. M. Tharp's including his farm and the Winslow land; thence to Mrs. Mary Dugan's including her land; thence to Dr. Prentis Meade's farm, including it; thence to Mrs. Elizabeth Dunaway's including her farm; thence down Kentucky river to the beginning.

NO. 11. NOTCH LICK.

Beginning on the Ohio river on the line between W. A. Pulliam and J. G. Kidwell thence up the Ohio river

his farm; thence to Wm. Wyatt's, excluding his farm, and the Winslow land; thence to S. S. Carlisle's excluding his farm and the farm of Miss Agnes Carlisle; thence to A. H. Myers', excluding his farm; thence a straight line to A. J. Taylor's, excluding his farm; thence to Ulysses Ford's excluding him and the lands of Joshua Ford; thence to Thomas Ball's, excluding his farm; thence to Mrs. Betsy Webster's, excluding her farm; thence with her north line to her tenant house on Major's Run; thence a straight line (excluding the farm of H. N. McDowell) to John D. Brindley, excluding his land; thence to the beginning.

NO. 15. ENGLISH.

Beginning at Wm. Hartman's barn on Kentucky river; thence to D. N. Demint's, excluding his farm; thence to Ben. T. Robertson's, including his farm, (except that portion purchased from Frank Brown's heirs); thence to Ben Hartman's, excluding his farm; thence to Jesse Tharp's lower line on Mill Creek; thence to E. B. Forsee's, excluding his farm; thence to L. N. Adcock's, including his farm, and excluding C. M. Adcock's; thence to Robert Moore's, excluding his farm; thence to Asa Nevill's including his farm; thence to the Butcher land, including it; thence to John P. Jones' excluding his farm; thence on the ridge to the farm of Joseph Blackwell including it; thence on the line between Sarah J. English and Joseph Blackwell to the beginning.

NO. 16. CENTREVILLE.

Beginning at Frank Johnson's excluding his farm; thence with the county line to the Carrollton & New Castle road, including the farms of Nancy Sidebottom and C. S. East; thence to Magruder Darnold's including his farm; thence to Peter Bright's including his farm; thence to Sam'l Wilson's on Thomas Piles' farm including said farm; thence to Rufus McMannis' including his farm; thence to Brown's branch and down same to a tenant house on the land of B. T. Robertson (at mouth of branch); thence up May's branch to James H. Batts', including his farm; thence to Mrs. Isabella Ford's including her farm; thence to Mrs. Donley's including her farm; thence to Thomas P. Masterson's including his farm and the lands of Fielding Vories; thence to George Hayden's, including his residence, but excluding the remainder of his farm; thence to D. B. Garritt's including his farm; thence to the beginning.

NO. 17. MILL CREEK.

Beginning on the county line on the line between James Adams and C. S. East; thence with the county line to the lands of J. O. Smoot excluding his farm; thence to Wm. Nevill's including his farm; thence to Robert Moore's including his farm; thence to Louis Adcock excluding his farm; thence to C. M. Adcock's including his farm; thence to E. B. Forsee including his farm; thence to Jesse Tharp's lower line and with said line to Mill Creek; thence to Ben Hartman's including his farm; thence to the mouth of May's branch including the lands of H. H. Adcock (inherited from

S. Griffith including his farm; thence to Fred Sherman's including his farm; thence to Willard Griffith's farm including it; thence to James Duguid's excluding his farm; thence with the line between the Freeman heirs and L. S. Owen to the Ohio river; thence down said river to the beginning.

Ellis, including his farm; thence to John Bethell's excluding his farm; thence a straight line to the beginning.

NO. 6. FAIRVIEW.

Beginning at the house on the land of J. O. Beabout (formerly occupied by Jno. King deceased) including it; thence with the county line to Ed. Rose's farm; thence a straight course to a tenant house on the farm of R. E. Coffield, now occupied by William Henry, including it; thence to a tenant house on the farm of Mrs. Mat Giltner, now occupied by Dennis Ladd, excluding it; thence to a tenant house on the farm of J. M. Giltner, now occupied by James Hall, including it; thence to H. B. Monroe, excluding the farms, except that portion bought from Henry Bear; thence to a tenant house on the land of O. Dewese, now occupied by James P. Turner, excluding it; thence to a tenant house on the land of S. E. Hampton, now occupied by John Taylor, including it; thence to a tenant house on the land of Conway heirs, now occupied by—Brittenback, including it; thence to Peter Westrick's excluding his farm; thence a straight line to R. O. King's including all of his farm except the tenant house now occupied by J. L. Cribbins; thence a straight line to the beginning, including the tenant house on Louis Craig's farm, now occupied by Frank Spillman.

Smith's heirs; thence with said line to the old Boone road; thence down the brier fork of Indian creek to Martin Smith's including his

NO. 10. PRESTONVILLE.

Beginning at the mouth of Kentucky river; thence down the Ohio river to the lower line of John Patton's farm, including said farm; thence to James G. King's on Little Kentucky river, including his farm; thence up Little Kentucky river to the upper line of Mrs. A. J. Taylor's farm, including said farm; thence down the Little Kentucky river so as to include the farm of Richard Metcalf, A. H. Myers, S. S. Carlisle; thence to Wm. Wyatt's, including his farm; thence to S. M. Tharp's including his farm and the Winslow land; thence to Mrs. Mary Dugan's including her land; thence to Dr. Prentis Meade's farm, including it; thence to Mrs. Elizabeth Dunaway's including her farm; thence down Kentucky river to the beginning.

NO. 11. NOTCH LICK.

Beginning on the Ohio river on the line between W. A. Pulliam and J. G. Kidwell; thence up the Ohio river to John Patton's lower line; thence with Patton & Neal's line to the top of the hill; thence a straight course to Charles Smith's at the foot of "dug" hill, excluding his farm; thence up King's branch to the line between Frank Neves and G. W. Adams; thence with said line to Scott's branch; thence down Scott's branch to Notch Lick (including a tenant house on W. B. Winslow's farm near the mouth of the branch); thence up Notch Lick to Frank Dunn's excluding his farm; thence to Joseph Tilley's excluding his farm; thence to William Keagle, including his farm and the lands of Robert Dunn, George Satchwell, Mrs. Creed Taylor, and Charles Harsin; thence to W. A. Pulliam's, including his farm; thence on the line between said Pulliam and J. G. Kidwell to the beginning.

NO. 12. HUNTERS BOTTOM.

NO. 26. CARROLLTON (UPPER) DISTRICT.

Beginning at foot of 5th street in Carrollton; thence up the Ohio river to the line between J. W. Butts and Mrs. Esther Leap; thence with said line to the top of the hill; thence around with the top of the hill following the back lines of Mrs. Esther Leap, M. I. Barker, T. C. Graves and A. R. Gaunt to Lostutter and Gaunt's corner; thence with the back lines of Wesley and Peter Lostutter and T. C. Hayden to the line between J. J. Hayden and J. C. Hayden; thence with said line to the Kentucky river; thence down said river to a point at which an extension of 5th street would intersect the river; thence to the south end of said street and with said street to Clay street; thence with Clay street to the alley between 4th and 5th streets; thence with said alley to Seminary street; thence with Seminary street to 5th street; thence with 5th street to the beginning.

NO. 27. CAMP BRANCH.

Beginning at the line between Joseph Blackwell and Miss Sarah Jane English, on the Kentucky river; thence up the river to the Henry county line; thence with the county line (including the Henry county fraction) to Jno Owen Smoot's, including his farm; thence to John P. Jones', including his farm; thence, on the ridge, to the farm of Joseph Blackwell, excluding it; thence with the line between said Blackwell and Miss Sarah Jane English to the beginning.

NO. 28. FORD'S.

Beginning on Corn Creek road at the Elliott's branch road; thence to Mrs. Susan Shoots', excluding her farm; thence down East Fork of Notch Lick to the forks of Notch Lick; thence to Joseph Tilley's, including him; thence to Anderson Sherman's, including him; thence to David Suter, including him; thence to John Green, including his land; thence to the Corn Creek road at Nathan Oull's, excluding his land; thence with the Corn Creek road to the county line; thence with the county line to Jno. Coghill's, excluding him; thence to Elliott's Branch road; thence up said road to the beginning.

mouth of "Four Mile;" thence with the river road to Four mile road; thence with 4-mile road to John C. Bond's, including his farm; thence to Scott Tandy's, excluding his farm; thence to Whites Run church; thence down the road to Whites Run creek; thence down said creek to its mouth; thence up Kentucky river to the mouth of Mill creek; thence up Mill creek to the Henry county line; thence with the Carroll county line to the Ohio river; thence up said river to the beginning.

NO. 2—GHENT.

Beginning at mouth of "Four mile;" thence with river road to four mile road; thence with said road to John C. Bond's, excluding his farm; thence to Scott Tandy's, including his farm; thence to Whites Run church; thence down the road to Whites Run creek; thence up said creek to upper Whites Run church; thence with the old Boone road to Ed Tandy's gate, including his house; thence with the pike and road to James Bond's, excluding his residence; thence a straight line to Si Gex's, including his residence; thence a straight line to the bridge on Jerry Craig's branch above Ghent; thence down said branch to the Ohio river and down the river to the beginning.

NO. 3—LYMAN CRAIG'S.

Beginning at the bridge on Jerry Craig's branch, above Ghent; thence a straight line to Si Gex's, excluding his residence; thence a straight line to James Bond's, including his residence; thence with the road and pike to E. J. Tandy's, excluding his residence; thence a straight line to Henry Miller's, including his farm; thence with the Gallatin county line to the Ohio river; thence with the river to mouth of Jerry Craig's branch; thence up said branch to the beginning.

NO. 4—HANDERS.

Beginning on Eagle creek on the Gallatin county line; thence with the county line to Henry Miller's, excluding his farm; thence a straight line to E. J. Tandy's, excluding him; thence with the Boone road to upper Whites Run church; thence with the road to Marvin chapel; thence with the Carrollton & Eagle road to Buffalo road; thence down Buffalo to Eagle creek; thence up Eagle creek to the beginning.

NO. 5—WORTHVILLE.

Beginning at mouth of Whites Run creek; thence up same to upper Whites Run church; thence with the road to Marvin chapel; thence with the Carrollton and Eagle pike to Buffalo road; thence down Buffalo to Eagle creek; thence down Eagle to the Kentucky river; thence around with the Henry county line to where it crosses the railroad (on Mill creek); thence down Mill creek to the Kentucky river; thence down Kentucky river to the beginning.
