This property is significant under criterion C as a good, well-preserved example of the decorated cottage, a local type significant to Boone County in the late 19th century (1850-1910). It is also a significant example of a plan type unusual in the area: double-cell and double-pile. []

14. History:
The gridded Ohio River town of Bellevue (Bellevue) was given the post office name of Grant. The major period of growth of the town was 1850-1900. The post office (see Be-8b), erected for Jonas Clore and always part of his town lot, was used as a post office until 1970.

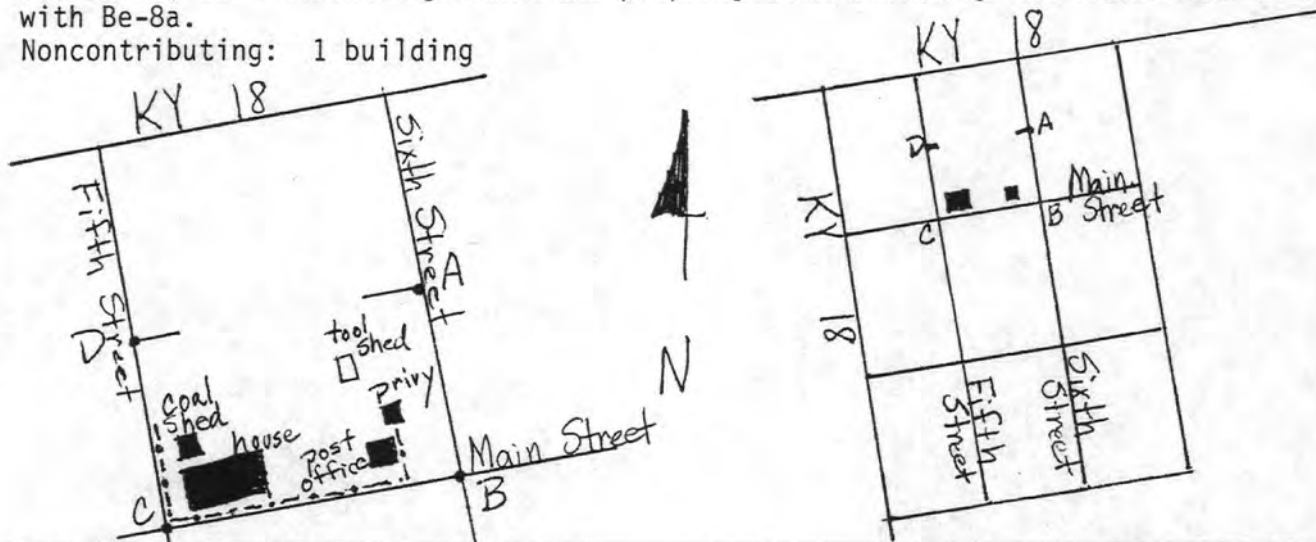
44. Site Plan (and boundary description and justification for N.R. sites):

The nominated property occupies city lot 23 and is roughly 200' x 150' in size. The boundary includes the entire city lot that has historically been associated with the property.

Contributing: 2 buildings, 1 structure (picket fence)

See Be-8b, an individually nominated property with a history and boundaries in common with Be-8a.

Noncontributing: 1 building



45. Description and House Plan:

The unusual plan of this 1½-story, frame, double-pile, double-cell house--most double-cell houses in Kentucky are only one room deep--is matched by the unusual attention to detail and proportion. The eaves are bracketed and the attic vents are pointed. The front porch is shed-roofed with chamfered posts; the back porch, a smaller version of the front porch and also sheltering two doors, has recently been enclosed. All windows are 6/6 double-hung sash.

The principal parlor of the house, entered through the right door, is finished in the interior with crossette moldings and a Greek-Italianate arched mantel in wood. The left room, containing an enclosed staircase, single-run, to the upper half-story, is finished with mitered woodwork of modified Greek Revival profile. The upstairs walls are tongue-and-groove paneled.

The coal shed and privy, both gabled with vertical-board siding, may have been built at the same time as the house and post office, while the tool shed is recent. The coal shed and privy contribute to the 19th century feeling of the site, while the picket fence visually unites the house and post office, always linked by ownership.
