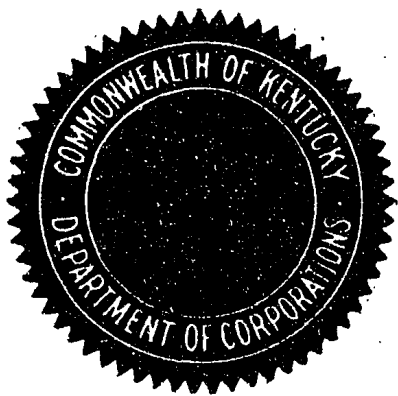

We, the undersigned, J. R. Ennis, W. J. Satterwhite, T. V. Toon, H. D. Brock, and Vetterbrock, of Jonesville, Ky. do hereby these Articles, associate ourselves together for the purpose of organizing and operating a Deposit Bank, in the town of Jonesville, Ky., (Grant County side of the town) to be known and styled as "Jonesville Deposit Bank" with power to adopt and use a corporate seal, to make contracts, to use and be sued, to appoint, remove and elect officers, define their duties, and require from any of them, a bond for the faithful discharge of their duties, to prescribe by its Board of Directors by-laws for the government of this corporation not inconsistent with law, to exercise, subject to law, such powers as may be necessary, to carry on the business of banking, discounting and negotiating notes, drafts, Bills of Exchange, and other evidences of debt, and purchasing bonds, receiving deposits; and a lending interest thereon; buying and selling exchange, coin, and bullion and lending money on personal and real security, and own real estate for Bankin. house purposes as provided by law.

ARTICLE NINT.

The principal place of business of the Corporation shall be Jonesville, Grant County, Ky.

ARTICLE 11.

The purpose of this corporation is to associate Capital together for the purpose of investing the same for the mutual benefit of its Stock-holders, and to furnish a safe Depository for the keeping of money, papers, and valuables of all kinds, and to carry on a general Bankin. business provided by the laws of the State of Kentucky.

ARTICLE 111.

The amount of its Capital Stock shall be TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$200,000.00) Dollars divided into Two-Hundred shares, in value of \$100.00 each, all of which stock has been in good faith subscribed and paid for

ARTICLE IX.

The private property of the Stock Holders of this Corporation, shall be liable for the corporate debts as provided by the law of the State of Kentucky.
