



18 continued : double 2/2 windows with transoms; double six-panel doors with glass transom above and paneled wood reveal, decorated stone lintel with brackets, two stone steps. Windows are double hung 2/2 with plain stone lug sills and decorated stone lintels. Side facades of original portion are Flemish bond brick with the same window treatment. 1884 addition is common bond brick with a cut stone water table to match the 1848 portion. Cornice, frieze, and windows all match the original, except windows have plain stone lintels. At joint of old and new sections on south facade is clock & bell tower above open porch. 2 steps lead up, segmental arches with keystones above porch openings. Door same as front leads to new wing. Square bell tower has round louvered openings on all sides, decorative brick recesses and corbeling above roof line. Entablature matches that of building. Clocks on all four faces set in pediments extending from roof of tower. 1975 addition to rear is sympathetic; brick with concrete water table to look like stone, stone sills & lintels, 2/2 windows. Interior has been modernized, broken into offices. Court room and jury room on second floor of original portion. County clerk's office has wooden cabinets; stairs in main hall are symmetrical double flight with landings--open string with carved newel posts and turned balusters.

19 continued : tower added. Pre-1940 brick was painted white; sandblasted 1975. Rear addition added at that time. Two bond issues to tear down courthouse and build new one have been defeated, in favor of keeping present historic building.







18 continued : stone sills and metal lintels. Corbeled brick architrave, metal cornice with dentil trim. Flat roof has sign on Shelby St. side, flanked by brackets and topped with pediment. Main St. facade is three bays, has same pilasters, cornice, corbeling and sign above center bay. Corner entry supported with plain columns, Main St. side has glass and cast iron store front (pilasters have paneled shafts, chevron trim and stylized capitals; painted red and white). Interior--modernized for drugstore on first floor; second floor (now storage) has small modern office space but remainder is the original old theatre, with balcony, projection booth, original decorative pressed metal ceiling and stair with pressed metal wainscot.

19 continued : opened movie theatre where apartments had been. In 1938, the bank was moved and a pool hall was put in its place. 1950 Balinger's Furniture Company moved in. During 1920's and 30's upper room was also used for meetings and classes. Between 1943 and 1945, there was a soda fountain here; Moreland Drug opened 1940, when theatre moved out. Late 1940's, housed a shoe factory. Moreland Drug Inc. purchased building from Max Goldberg in 1970, all changes to exterior done at that time.



19. History Tyree Oldham willed the property with two houses to his daughters (one of whom was married to William Kennett) in 1814. Kennett established tavern. In later years, the building was used for a restaurant and ice cream parlor, and undertaking business, and other commercial uses. Now shops and rental.			
20. Significance Oldest commercial building in the original business district; notable example of Federal style.			

18 continued: two stone steps leading up. South building is 4-bay, lower openings seem to be intact, except flat arches have been replaced with wooden lintels. Doors are panelled with transoms, original steps. Both windows have been replaced, though surrounds are intact. Upper openings on both buildings are intact with flat arches, double hung 2/2; north building has narrow plain wooden lug sills, south has plain slip sills. Far right window boarded over; others in south upper are 6/9. Row of small dentils below simple box cornice (evidence of decorative soffit). Interior end chimneys on both buildings, with two in middle at interior ends. Building joint evident on upper story. Gable end roof with seamed metal, painted black. South facade has been painted for advertising; two windows with flat arches in upper story, now boarded over. One window in lower, 4/4 double hung with wooden lintel. Eaves do not extend at gable ends. Bulkhead opening in foundation. East facade has some original openings, boarded over, unpainted brick, rear extension of building (basically T-plan). East Side Card Club building butts up to facade. North facade is unpainted common bond, no openings, butts up to library building. Interior modernized for stores, rental space.



18 continued : Maple St. facade has bay with corner brackets below eaves, decorative inset in the gable end, pie-shaped windows either side of chimney. All other windows and doors have plain stone sills, carved stone lintels. Porches have machine turned balusters and posts and decorative trim; corner eaves above bays have brackets, gable ends have decorative insets. Roof is asphalt shingle, many chimneys with corbeled brick caps and terra cotta chimney pots. Box cornice, iron cresting on top of hip. Large yard has many large maple trees, enclosed with cast iron fence. Interior retains all original woodwork--high doorways with architrave trim and corner blocks, sliding doors between rooms, oak floors, stair of carved oak with pendant trim. High ceilings; mantels of carved wood with tile fireplace surrounds. General style reflects residences to be found in Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky from same period--it is said that Henry Bullock visited Cincinnati to look at houses before drawing up plans for this one.

The house is a fine example of the Greek Revival style, with its symmetrical facade and classical details. 18 continued : with brick flat arches, plain lug sills. Gable end has round opening, now filled in, with stone plaque below. Plain box cornice, eaves extend. Entrances now on east and west sides, same windows as front repeat on side facades. East and west facades divided by brick piers; doors are three steps up, double 6-panel with stained glass transoms. Roof is asphalt shingle. Bell tower on SW corner, originally steeple base, now has louvered belfry, square tower with corbeled brick and battlements. Seam evident where 1926 addition (second story) was made, especially where building meets Conrad's Hardware. Interior retains all original woodwork--pulpit, pews, floor. Rectangular interior, balcony at upper rear.

19 continued : with art glass windows. Two vestibules were constructed, one on each side, to create two entrances. In 1926, the church was enlarged to make room for choir seating behind pulpit and a second story was added to house Sunday school rooms, kitchen and dining room. Balcony built at rear of church, and steeple changed to bell tower. Third remodeling in 1957, when basement was added and oil furnace installed. Second floor divided into smaller rooms. Building was sandblasted and painted in 1965.



18 continued: into three bays by double modillions (three second story windows per bay, single modillions between windows). Four decorative metal rosettes define bays. Edge of red standing seam metal roof shows above the cornice. All decorative trim painted white. East facade shares party wall with Variety Store. West facade has random windows with plain stone sills and lintels. Brick in need of repair. Church butts up to wall. Concrete block addition on north side opens onto Maple Street. Original roof was metal, now asphalt sheeting. Eleven chimneys with decorative pots have been removed. Interior has been modernized for store on first floor. Second floor has one large room (used for dress shop at one time) which is painted with peacock design. Many small offices with original fireplaces, some with carved wooden mantels, others marbleized metal. All windows and doors have decorative architrave trim with corner blocks. Windows have louvered shutters.

19 continued: has always been used for commercial purposes--most notably until early 20th century when owned by Applegates, and then from 1918 until 1975 when owned by the Arnold family. During its long commercial history, the building has housed a number of dress shops, shoe stores, hardware stores. Conrads purchased building in 1975, and continue long commercial tradition with a hardware and furniture store. During the period 1918-1931, part of the building was leased for the Post Office. SW portion of the upper floor has been converted to an apartment, and the remaining rooms are used for stock and storage.

The boundaries of the Central Falmouth Historic District are described as follows:

Beginning at the northwest corner of the property identified as 302 Shelby and following that northern property line to Maple Street; crossing Maple Street and following the northern property lines of the Falmouth Methodist Church and 226 Shelby through 200 Shelby to the western side of Chapel Street. Proceeding north along the western edge of Chapel Street to the southern property line of 203 Chapel, then to Point A, following the southern and western property lines of 203 Chapel and western property line of 201 Chapel; across Second Street and along western, northern, and eastern property lines of St. Francis Xavier Church. Across Second Street and east along the northern property line of the Church of the Nazarene, then south along the eastern property lines of the Nazarene Church, 202, and 204 Chapel Street. Then east along the southern edge of the Courthouse parking lot to the west side of Main Street. Proceeding south along the west side of Main crossing Main and proceeding east along the northern property line of the Kennett Tavern (Point B). Then south along the eastern property line of the Kennett Tavern to Shelby Street, crossing Shelby Street to the northern property lines of the Phoenix Hotel and 109 Shelby. Then along northern, eastern and southern property lines of 109 Shelby and the southern property line of the Phoenix Hotel, across to the western side of Main Street. Then south along the western side of Main Street to the southern property line of the Roller Rink (Point C). Along the southern and western property lines of the Roller Rink, continuing north along the western property lines of 313 and 303 Main Street. Then west along the southern property lines of 113 through 135 Shelby Street, across Chapel Street and continuing west along the southern property lines of the Falmouth Post Office and 205 and 211 Shelby Street. Then north along the western property lines of 211 Shelby Street to the south side of Shelby and west along Shelby to the eastern property line of the Falmouth Christian Church. Finally, along the eastern and southern property lines of the Falmouth Christian Church to Point D, thence proceed north along the west property line of said church, crossing Shelby Street, continuing north along the western property line of 302 Shelby Street to the point of origin (Point E).
