BEDFORD,

A post village and capital of Trumble county, 6 miles from the Ohio river, 46 miles north-west from Frankfort, 90 miles from Covington, 42 miles from Louisville, and by stage route 14 miles from Jericho. One mile from the village is an epsom salts spring, surcharged with sulphur, and near it ample accommodations are provided for visitors.

The village contains the public buildings of the county, one Methodist, one Baptist, and one Christian church, one seminary, one Masonic lodge, (Bedford No. 158,) one steam flouring mill, four hotels, three general stores, three physicians, four attorneys, two magistrates, one ambrotypist, one carding machine, one tanner, one jeweler, two milliners, and some ten or twelve mechanical trades. Population 400. Post office established in 1814.
